Description:

The secondary II History course follows a revision of the essential terms and concepts related to the study of history. Students will focus primarily on events and topics continuing from the previous year's study (i.e. Ancient History). These include: a new vision of humanity, European expansion, The French Revolution, Industrialization, Imperialism and Colonialism, Achieving Civil Rights and Freedoms and Globalization. Throughout the course of the year students will use the historical method to study and interpret some of the key events or developments which unfolded from the middle-ages to the contemporary period.
