Additional information:

The secondary II geography course begins with an introduction to the various terms, concepts and skills that are essential to the study of cities, regions and countries. Following this introduction, students examine a short history and background of selected locations around the world. The course will focus on the following topics: 1) The Heritage City of Quebec, 2) Forest Regions, 3) Industrial Regions, 4) Energy-Producing Regions, 5) Agricultural Territories at Risk, 6) Native Territories For each topic, students will learn about the various environmental issues facing decision-makers and the solutions/responses to such issues in particular contexts.

Notes:
